Data Privacy Statement

The selection process for the Hermann Neuhaus Prize is jointly conducted by the Max Planck Society and the Hermann Neuhaus Foundation. A joint selection committee of the Max Planck Society and the Hermann Neuhaus Foundation decides on the selection of the Hermann Neuhaus Award winner. In exceptional cases the submitted data may be transferred to further experts inside and outside Germany, but not outside the EU, for the purpose of evaluation.

The submitted data will be stored on servers belonging to the Max Planck Society and send via encoded e-mail to the members of the selection committee and possible experts. The data of candidates will be archived for a period of seven years and then destroyed in a manner compliant with data protection regulations.

The Max Planck Society and the Hermann Neuhaus Foundation will publish a positive decision giving the first name, last name, academic title, contact details, research area and key words to describe the particular field of research.

The legal basis of the data processing is Article 6, paragraph 1, letter b of the GDPR, § 26, paragraph 1 of the German Federal Data Protection Act (BDSG) for mandatory fields and consent based on Article 6, paragraph 1, letter a of the GDPR and § 26, paragraph 2 of the BDSG for optional fields.
